When the fellowship gathers to make decisions, it is doing more than reaching consensus — it is opening itself to guidance from a Higher Power. • Group conscience is grounded in NA's spiritual foundation, not merely in democratic process. • The goal is not just agreement among members, but alignment with something greater than any individual opinion. • This elevates service decisions from the practical to the purposeful.	• Unity is found in commitment to the process, not in the absence of differing views.
2. Humility Is the Starting Point For group conscience to function as intended, members must approach it with humility. This means setting aside personal agendas, ego, and preferences in order to genuinely seek what is best for the fellowship and those it serves. • No single member's view should dominate the process — every voice is part of the whole. • Humility means being willing to be wrong, and to change one's position when the conscience of the group points elsewhere. • Members who come to meetings with fixed outcomes in mind undermine the spiritual nature of the process.	5. Personal Agendas Distort the Process When members or trusted servants attempt to steer the group conscience toward a predetermined outcome, the spiritual integrity of the process is compromised. The Sixth Concept calls for vigilance against self-will dressed up as group conscience. • Manipulation, withholding of information, or applying social pressure are all obstacles to true group conscience. • Trusted servants must be especially careful not to use their position to influence outcomes for personal reasons. • Recognizing and naming these behaviors protects the fellowship's ability to make spiritually grounded decisions.
3. Informed Participation Is Essential A group conscience is only as sound as the information available to those participating in it. Members have a responsibility to come prepared — having read relevant materials, understood the issues, and considered the impact of potential decisions. • Uninformed voting weakens the group conscience and can lead the fellowship astray. • Trusted servants have a responsibility to present information clearly and completely so members can participate meaningfully. • Taking time to study an issue before voting reflects respect for the spiritual weight of the process.	6. Connection to NA's Primary Purpose Decisions made through genuine group conscience serve NA's primary purpose: to carry the message to the addict who still suffers. When the fellowship invites a loving God into its decision-making, its choices are more likely to reflect compassion, wisdom, and long-term thinking. • Group conscience keeps service focused on those NA exists to help, rather than on internal politics or individual preferences. • Spiritually grounded decisions tend to strengthen the fellowship and build trust over time. • The Sixth Concept reminds us that NA's work is not just organizational — it is a spiritual mission carried out together.

RCM 1 Report

Hello everyone, two weeks ago I attended the May regional meeting. It was filled with a lot of some really great discussion and connection with members. I'm happy to report that the Regional Venue Chair and Literature treasurer positions were filled. I'm taking a bit of a different approach with this report and moving forward. There are the obvious things that need to be passed along, so I will be putting them in my reports; but I would like to also list all of the discussion topics and ask which ones you all would like to hear more about and then I will include them in my next 2 reports.

I have also been actively working on updating the guidelines for our area. I was able to invite members from the region willing to be a part of our workgroup and we are looking at setting a date to get together.

Regional mileage

Proposal: change guidelines for regional mileage from gas receipts to 0.50 cents/KM to be aligned with the region and other areas.

Discussion topic:

Outside sales at meetings (bootleg literature, cigarettes, peptides): Have you seen this happening? Is it being shut down? What are the responses when this happens? Please email me your groups thoughts and answers to sofasc@bcrna.ca

Area Challenges & Discussion Topics

A common theme across multiple Areas continues to be service participation, mentorship, and supporting trusted servants.

Many Areas shared similar challenges:

- Difficulty filling service positions
- Smaller groups having only a few homegroup members
- Trusted servants stepping into roles without experience or guidance

Other more specific discussion topics included:

- Lotto licences for events
- Challenging and disruptive behaviours; specifically in group chats or on social media
- The importance of the 7th Tradition and contributions in general

Information from the Regional Delegate

I personally had a really great discussion with the RD in regards to the NAWS financial inquiry that was brought to the table a few months ago. And the current short answer for this is there was a TON of discussion about this topic in the past and at the time the grants were taken and there was consensus that approved NAWS to proceed with this. I can understand how some people believes this is breaking traditions and what we as NA members feel about being completely self-supporting. But at the same time NAWS is a business, they produce our literature, have offices that they operate out of and employees that receive compensation for running the business. That being said, NAWS does try to work according to the traditions and concepts as much as possible, and yes they are held responsible to the members, groups and regions to do the work asked of them; but they are still a business and not completely held to the traditions as the groups. Contributions have been declining over the last several years and costs have steadily increased, while our literature costs have remained the same for as long as possible furthering to carry our message to the still suffering addict. So NAWS, needed to make a business decision to take the grants offered to continue to operate, keep people employed and carry our message.

That being said I have forwarded the letter brought to area to the RD and he is going to get back to me with something more formally written.

World Service Conference 2026

The 2026 World Service Conference brought together NA members from around the world, including representation from 43 countries and 31 languages.

A major focus of this conference was strengthening communication, supporting trusted servants, and helping groups carry the message more effectively.

Building Stronger Groups & Service

One of the biggest discussions was about what makes NA service strong. Common themes included:

- Unity between groups, area, and region
- Better communication and follow-through

- Supporting and mentoring trusted servants
- Encouraging members to become involved in service
- Practicing spiritual principles in all levels of service

A common challenge identified was that information is not always making it back to homegroups. GSRs play an important role by making sure communication goes both ways — bringing information from Area back to groups but also bringing the group conscience back to Area.

Supporting Trusted Servants

Many regions are experiencing similar struggles with:

- Lack of service participation
- Trusted servants feeling overwhelmed or burned out
- Members stepping into positions without training or support

The solution discussed was focusing more on:

- Mentorship
- Helping newer members learn service
- Sharing why we serve
- Creating welcoming spaces where members feel comfortable getting involved

Service is not just filling positions — it is how we help carry the message.

Fellowship Updates & Priorities

The fellowship identified several important areas of focus moving forward:

- Welcoming the newcomer
- Addressing disruptive and predatory behaviour
- Improving mentorship
- Attracting more members into service
- Updating service resources
- Reviewing literature needs

NA World Services Update

NA World Services shared that literature sales alone are no longer enough to fully support services.

Seventh Tradition contributions continue to be important because they help support:

- Fellowship development
- Literature access
- Carrying the message worldwide

Groups are encouraged to continue having conversations about how we support NA services.

Moving Forward

The biggest message from the conference was connection.

Strong groups create strong areas and strong regions. By improving communication, supporting each other in service, mentoring newer members, and practicing spiritual principles, we continue strengthening NA as a whole.
